

Welcome to the September edition of our local newsletter

Our Parish is growing and we hope that the new residents around Tarves across to Barthol Chapel read this newsletter, and it will introduce you all to the range of local businesses/local tradesmen and activities available for everyone.

Yes, we can knock on a neighbour's door, text, and meet a friend, walk for a pint of milk – all reachable by foot or car but what would the word 'local' mean if we were living on one of remote islands of the world. I was given a gift of Atlas of Remote Islands with the sub heading of 'Fifty Islands I have not visited and never will'. A straightforward heading, but descriptions of their history and consequences are unsettling. A friend of mine visited St Kilda recently and photographs showing the beauty of Hirta, the main island, were breathtaking but the story of the islands and their subsequent abandonment leave unanswered questions on how islanders could have lived with only the most basic tools/food available and a repetitive diet of gannets (p 34). Life became unsustainable and the remaining residents asked to be relocated to mainland Scotland in 1930.

The author is Judith Schalansky and her 16-page introduction to this unique book is stunning, with a potted history of exploration across the 5 oceans



when ships' crew said goodbye to their families with no further contact with them for

months even years. Often these remote islands were 'claimed' by the visiting nation of the boats and resulting history does not make particularly good reading in terms of exploitation and treatment of those who called the islands 'home'. There is so much history and geography contained in this slim book that I have already planned my winter reading.





There will be various events in the village and surrounding area over the next few months. We would really like to see some new faces and welcome them to what this village and wider Parish has to offer for all ages.

Dear Friends

Over the summer holidays something quite unusual happened in the manse. In other homes it would be something quite normal, but for the manse it was out of the ordinary. And that surprising thing was that we de-cluttered. And specifically, we de-cluttered the kids' 'playroom'. My children are now 10 ½ and 6 yet we were storing games and toys and activities that they'd had, in some cases, since they were born, but we'd been keeping more or less all of their stuff. The reasons for that were two-fold - firstly, the time and motivation for it to happen never seemed to fall on the same day (or week) and secondly, one of my children is a little more sentimental about keeping things than the other, so it just takes him a bit of time to get his head round what's happening.

However, on a warm Tuesday morning a couple of weeks ago, we began the de-cluttering and sorting process. It took a few days to get everything sorted and to decide what was going to be kept, what was going to be donated to other people. This was helped enormously by a wonderful member of Ellon Parish Church with young children, who also have boy cousins who she could disseminate much of our played with stuff to, and what was going to be 'yeeted' (an urban slang term that means 'to throw something with a lot of force and abandon' that my children love to use) at the recycling centre. The permission to 'yeet' broken items really helped my son who finds getting rid of things hard because 'yeeting' is apparently a lot of fun!

Once we had cleared, sorted, donated, recycled and yeeted we were left with a playroom (now renamed the 'gaming room') where things could be put away in labelled boxes or baskets and there is room to play games or with their toys. And the most amazing thing happened - they started to find things that they had not played with for years. It was like Christmas had come halfway through the year as they discovered the joy of Lego, they had forgotten they had, or hot wheels tracks they had not been able to haul out because there was not enough room or they could not find all the bits for. And even more amazingly for Nicola and I, they were able (with a little encouragement) to put the things back again because they knew where they were meant to go, there was space for them and the 'gaming room' was ready for the next day's adventure.

Ambrose of Milan, the ancient thinker and Bishop of Milan from 374 to 397, once wrote 'a possession ought to belong to the possessor, not the possessor to the possession.' In other words, we should not feel owned by our stuff, which is what I think we had

succumbed to with that room in the manse. We'd not been able to clear it out because the stuff had begun to own us - we didn't have the time and we didn't have the emotional capacity and so it began to 'own' us. Yet, now there is a joy and freedom that we can find what we need to find, tidy things away easily and simply be in the calm space.

I think the same thinking can apply to our spiritual lives as well. Those who live a life of faith often need to de-clutter their lives so that their life of faith can be found. When times of joy or pain comes, we need to be able to find our faith quickly and in amongst all the other competing voices. We need to be able to find the voice of God reminds us that '...the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words.' (Romans 8:26).

A life of faith in Jesus invites us to 'yeet' the things that weigh us down so we can live in the freedom of being unconditionally loved. In speaking to his friends Jesus once said, 'Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30)

My prayer for you in this season is that you can 'yeet' those things that weigh you down and you can live into a life of lightness and for you to find those around you who can support you with that.

Update from Hanover Court



Haddo Choral & Operatic Society was founded by the late June Gordon, Marchioness of Aberdeen in 1945 at the end of the second World War, to bring high quality music to the local community, not only to watch, but to be part of; bringing professionals to Haddo to sing alongside a choir made up of the local community, who's only qualifications were a love of singing. June Gordon wielded the baton as conductor for 60 years, but although she is gone, HHCOS is still thriving, sticking to our belief that anyone can sing, all you need is the desire to do so. There are no auditions, no requirement to read music, just a commitment to come regularly to rehearsals and maybe do a spot of private practice (cows make a very attentive audience by the way). It can be hard work, but with a little guidance from our Musical Director Dr Paul Tierney, we produce professional concerts 3 times a year. So why not come along to Haddo to hear the fruits of our labour as we sing Carl Orff's Carmina Burana on September 14th (accompanied by 2 pianos and 7 percussionists!) and Thea Musgrave's Black Tambourine (which may well be the first time this has been performed in Scotland), or come to one of our Carol Concerts in the Chapel to kick off your Christmas (book early, we usually sell out). Or maybe you might like to exercise your vocal chords and become part of our singing community - we are a friendly bunch and love to welcome new members. Fundraising

Our application to the Scottish Land Fund for stage one funding was successful! We can now apply to the next stage of the process (to buy the property) and have been allocated a development grant of £11,000 towards Business Planning and Architects fees. The purpose of this grant is to help us develop the project to meet the requirements for the next stage in the application process. This is a major step forward for the hub. We are now in the process of appointing a business manager to help with driving the project forward.

Our initial enquiry to the Architectural Heritage Fund was accepted and we have a full application in. This is for a Project Viability Grant to cover the costs of a building valuation and a condition survey.

We should hear whether we have been successful in our application to Awards for All some time in August. This will cover the cost of arranging some events from autumn onwards and our agreement with the Church of Scotland to use the building. We really appreciate the church entering into this agreement with us, to give us time to move to a purchasing position. We are very grateful for your donations at hub events. This income allows us to cover our day to day costs even if some grant funding doesn't come through. We will, of course, be looking to apply for other grants.


network, engage, share ideas and support young people in their faith journeys.





Since our last article we have completed the re-jig of our workshop which has allowed us to create more working space and to be able to move benches and machinery around as jobs demand.

To allow men in full time work to attend the Shed, we are extending our opening hours on alternate Thursdays to 9pm. These extended hours will apply on alternate

Thursdays from 5th September (ie 19th Sept, 3rd Oct etc.).

We have received planning permission for a new portacabin. This will allow us to reorganise some of our work areas to create an indoor mechanical workshop (for repairing bikes, motor bikes etc.) and to expand our computer area. We are looking for a suitable portacabin and will be seeking funding to pay for it! If you have any suggestions about sourcing a portacabin (or a suitable container) please get in touch.

Cycling UK (via the Aberdeenshire Bothy) have supported one of our members to attend a bike maintenance course, so we now have accreditation for repairing bikes.

The IT training initiative with Aberdeenshire Community Learning and Development (CLD) is continuing and proving to be very popular. The drop-in sessions are on Thursdays at 1-2.30pm. Two of the Shed members are now embarking on SQA qualifications to further support this activity and to help Shed members increase their computing skills.

To accommodate the increased use of computers, especially associated with 3D printing, the CNC machine and laser engraving we are increasing our computing area in the main shed. To do this, the model railway has been dismantled (currently we have no members interested in the model railway).

In the workshop we are making mink trackers. At the request of the Scottish Invasive Species Initiative, we are making 20 floating platforms that record the presence of mink. Mink are an invasive species, they are carnivores with a voracious appetite for birds and their eggs, small mammals, fish, amphibians, shellfish and crustaceans. You should report a mink sighting in this area to by emailing sisi@nature.scot .

In the garden, our pétanque piste is now complete. We have had good interest in starting a pétanque club (for men and women) at the Shed with our first meeting held on the 8th August. We have experienced players and a coach to help get us going. Until we lose the evening daylight we will meet on a Thursday evening. Please see our website and Facebook pages for announcements about future meeting times. If you are interested, please get in touch.

On the 10th April, in collaboration with Aberdeenshire Council's Community & Learning team, we held a Family Learning Workshop at the Shed. Several families with young children came






