Hello readers and welcome to the first newsletter of 2024.

#### Introduction to Hygge - Koselig - Lagom - Niksen

These are words from mainly Scandinavian countries which describe their outlook on ways of living that may otherwise be seen as circumstances 'we just have to live with'. It has been a difficult winter and weather in January 2024 was a low point. Unless you have relatives or friends who live overseas, we may never know how other nationalities manage their winters/dark nights or even dark days. However, we can adopt a few practices from some of our Nordic neighbours.

**Hygge** – a word meaning 'wellbeing', originally from Norway but now adopted by the Danes, and consequently transferred to print by Meik Wiking into The Little Book of Hygge. I was given this as a present a number of years ago, and it is almost an annual winter read. It's not about owning anything grand, it's not about competitiveness but more concentrating on atmosphere and experience. It does reflect how we perceive a Scandinavian lifestyle, all countries have similar problems to us, but address them with a different and more person-focussed approach.

**Koselig** – is a Norwegian word, again meaning 'wellbeing' but concentrating on relationships with friends and family and searching out for that magic moment in a dark and cold day. It also encourages active social planning so there is something to look forward to whether it may be morning coffee, lunch, afternoon tea or dinner – it's not a monetary count as it is a myth that buying something grand equates with self-congratulation on an achievement. Morning coffee and a scone with friends celebrates much more.

**Lagom** – we're moving across to Sweden now where similar beliefs are followed and balanced with a simpler lifestyle. No bulk buying here, take jars/boxes to refill shops and buy what you need for now, count to 10 before you buy anything or throw something out and ask yourself 'do I need this' or 'can I fix this?' Another suggestion from the Swedes is to leave work on time and allow the evening for family and friends or using this extra time to enjoy being outdoors – properly dressed of course.

**Niksen** is the (nearly) last word for today. Almost, but not quite, Scandinavian. The Netherlands have this wonderful word meaning quite simply 'doing nothing'. It's not laziness, it's almost time off to regroup and could in fact be seen as best use of your time.

...... and let us not forget how to '**coorie in**', it may never earn a whole book of its own but it sure does merit a place in our lives.

Another few weeks until longer daylight hours, start planning now so that you build in time to enjoy that work/life balance that benefits you, family and friends.

#### Dear Friends

It is not often a minister is writing what they know will be their first and last letter as parish minister. But effectively this is my first letter as minister of Formartine Parish Church since the union of Barthol Chapel, Pitmedden and Tarves Kirks on 1 January 2024 and my last letter before retiring – my last Sunday will be Easter Sunday.

Even although the congregations have been working towards the union for some months there is always the unexpected to deal with and the last weeks have flown past as we have dealt with various challenges together. It has been a steep learning curve but I have thoroughly enjoyed getting to know the people of Pitmedden better. And there seems to be real excitement and enthusiasm over the prospect of everyone working more closely together. To the people of Barthol Chapel and Tarves I would say that it has been a joy and a privilege to be your minister over the last seven years – through what has been a time of significant change in the Church. And I'm sure that God is already preparing the person who will be called to be the next Minister of Word and Sacrament in Formartine Parish.

Easter is a time of endings and new beginnings. For the first followers of Jesus there was the sadness of Jesus death on the cross on Good Friday – their grief over the loss of the earthly companion with whom they had journeyed along the road of life. And as in any situation of loss we know their grief was combined with guilt as they looked back and saw things that they might have said and done differently.

But for those first followers of Jesus there was also the challenge of the empty tomb - and the possibilities which that opened up for them. That first Easter the stone was rolled away and God breathed the Spirit of forgiveness and new life into their hearts and minds. And they had to wrestle with what it meant for them to move forward and live into the amazing grace and love of God revealed in Jesus Christ. And it was as they did this that they discovered for themselves the sense of purpose, the joy and the hope that faith offers.

Beginnings and endings, endings and beginnings are always significant times in our lives – whilst it is right to acknowledge the grief and the challenges that these sometimes bring, it is equally important to hold onto God's promise of life now and for all eternity.

In some words from the Scottish paraphrase of Romans 8

Nor death, nor life, nor earth nor hell, nor time's destroying sway, Can e-er efface us from God's heart, or make his love decay. Each future period that will bless as it has blessed the past: He loved us from the first of time. He loves us to the last

On that note with some sadness but also in positive anticipation of the next stage of the journey for each one of us, I wish you God's blessing.

Alison is retiring soon and her last Sunday will be Easter Day, 31 March. We have been very fortunate to share our journey with her as our minister and the occasion will be marked after our Easter Celebration.

There is still much to do as we explore how best to move forward in the union. The new Kirk Session has met and I was appointed as the Session Clerk. Once things are more settled, I will give you a fuller list of the office bearers.





#### News on upgrading the Melvin Hall

The work to upgrade the Melvin Hall has commenced.

The resilience generator was installed just before Christmas with the fuel tank scheduled for delivery before the end of February, the majority of the cost being met by way of a substantial grant from SSEN.

New bespoke energy efficient windows are being manufactured by Colin Massie, they should have been installed prior to the publication of this edition of the TBC, again the majority of the cost has been secured via grant funding, this time via the Aberdeenshire Local Action Group Challenge Fund.

Further grant funding is being sourced to help cover the cost of installing insulation, an air-to-air source pump plus solar panels with storage batteries. These upgrades to our hall are a major project so please bear with us whilst we try to raise the necessary funding.


#### **Barthol Chapel Community Hub Gaining Momentum**




