

Perspective

Over the summer Nicola and I took our boys to Center Parcs. Between swimming and BBQs, Daniel decided to tackle the high aerial adventure course. He clambered across ropes and soared down zip lines with far more courage than I expected — cheered on by the rest of us. James, meanwhile, tried his hand at fencing. At one point we had to slap each other with a glove and declare: "I challenge you to a duel!" The alternative, the instructor said, was simply to shout: "HEY YOU! I WANNA FIGHT!" Needless to say, the boys spent the week yelling this at one another.

Moments like these remind me how perspective shapes everything. From one angle, it was an ordinary family holiday; from another, it was absurd, hilarious, and rather brave. The same is true in the wider world. News headlines show the conflict in Ukraine or the devastation in Gaza from different perspectives — governments argue, leaders disagree, and sometimes even the definition of "famine" becomes contested. But while perspectives differ, the people caught in the middle are the ones who suffer most.

This, I believe, is where we find God's perspective. Through the prophet Isaiah we hear: "Learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow." God sees the vulnerable and calls us to do the same.

So, whether in the absurdity of a family adventure or the complexity of world events, perspective matters. And the good news is that God's perspective is not hidden from us. In Christ we see a God who draws near to the hurting, who notices the overlooked, and who lifts up the vulnerable. May we be encouraged that, however confusing the world may feel, God is at work bringing hope and healing.

Ellon and District Men's Shed

Since the last article in March there have been several important developments at the Shed.

The mechanical workshop is fully up and running. We have been donated lots of bikes, including some 'high end' models and these are being refurbished for sale. At times, we have more bikes than we can handle, and we then pass them on to Stella's Voice as they have a large bike repair workshop. We have now refurbished 5 'classic' motorbikes (photo) and two mini-motorbikes. If you are interested in getting involved with bike or motor bike refurbishing, please get in touch.

Ten solar panels and a battery system have been installed. These are working very well, we hope that this system will save us between 25% and 50% of our electricity costs and contribute to a reduction in our carbon footprint.

We have been very fortunate to receive a grant from Scottish Government Rural Communities Poverty Alleviation Fund which has allowed us to purchase more equipment and materials for the workshops to allow us to increase our activities. Part of this funding was used to buy a second 3D printer. This has significantly increased our capability in this area and fits well with the 3D-printing training courses we are offering to Shed members.

The 3D printers, laser engraver and CNC wooding working machine have been very busy making a large range of items including wooden puzzles, phone holders, house signs, and presentation 'medals'.

The woodworking workshop has had a second order from the Scottish Invasive Species Initiative for 20 mink trackers. Other significant projects included stage scenery for the Ythan Amateur Dramatic Association. These big projects go along with the 'smaller' requests for mud kitchens, benches, trugs, planters, house signs, bird boxes etc..

The Shed's Pétanque Club continued meeting on Thursday afternoons. Please see our Facebook page for announcements about future meeting times. If you are interested, please get in touch.

On the 7th August in collaboration with Aberdeenshire Council Community Learning and Development, we held a workshop for families to work together to make bird boxes, bird feeders (with recycled materials) and to do some 3D printing (photo).

The garden has had a good summer with a great crop of strawberries and a good supply of tomatoes, potatoes, carrots and other fruit and veg. We are seeking funding to replace the polytunnel with a more solid polycarbonate version (a Polycrub). We hope to have this in place by the end of the year.

In March we submitted an Expression of Interest to Aberdeenshire Council for a Community Asset Transfer to secure long-term control of the Shed beyond the term of our current lease (to August



2030). As we have now reached the physical limits of our workshops and site we are also seeking to expand the area of the Shed's grounds. As part of this process we have revised our constitution. The newly approved constitution has been supported by OSCR (Scottish Charity Regulator) and has now been adopted by the Shed.

The Wednesday sessions of the developing Women's Shed have been very well received by the attendees. The induction and training process is a key part of this journey and will take time to work through to fully establish a stand-alone Women's Shed. The Men's Shed will carry on being run as a social/hobby place for men. The underpinning need for a dedicated *men's* shed hasn't changed. William D Massie Snr worked as a joiner in the area before joining the local joiner in the late 1930s, it was customary that the local joiner was responsible for undertaking.


In 1945 Willie was offered the tenancy of the joiner's workshop in Tarves from the Laird of Haddo.
